

47 Mayor Torres stated that the Legislation is in session. We are concerned on the impact it may
48 have to the Town, especially for the Fire Fund and Law Enforcement Protection Fund. Which we
49 receive \$227,000 from the Fire Fund and \$33,000 from the Law Enforcement Protection Fund.
50 The Solvency Bill, they are not talking about taking it away, but taking away the balance in those
51 accounts for those funds, which may hurt future distributions.

52
53 JTP has approved 28 jobs for Centex, 43 jobs for AmFab Steel, and 20 jobs for Phat Steel.
54 These jobs will greatly impact our community directly. If you see our legislators please express
55 to them the need for JTP funding.

56
57 Mayor Torres stated he met with Jerry Shylo, the Rio Rancho Chamber Director, he indicated he
58 was willing to advocate for us in Santa Fe to the Legislators. I shared our concerns with him.

59
60 Mayor Torres stated that Andy Edmondson and Ida Fierro met with Coronado Little League
61 Board members today to present them all the information on the concession stand from funding
62 to payment of contractors. The meeting went well. They presented the Town with their last
63 payment of \$10,000 for the project.

64
65 Mayor Torres shared a letter written to NMDOT Secretary Church on the expansion of 550 and
66 the impact to the businesses. A copy of the letter was also sent to our legislators.

67
68 Mayor Torres shared a video about Service that was presented at a Martin Luther King
69 Celebration he attended.

70
71 There being no further business, Councilor Sisneros moved to adjourn the meeting at 6:48 P.M.
72 The motion was seconded by Councilor Dominguez and carried unanimously.
