The Recreation Center has also been updated from a technological standpoint with the installation of Wi-Fi in the building. Along with open gym for basketball, the Recreation Center also hosts the Bernalillo Youth Basketball Program, Sandoval Senior Games events, badminton, pickleball, line dancing, shuffleboard, and other various special events. The Recreation Center is also home to Camp Coronado Summer Recreation, a program which promotes youth, ages 5-12, participation in recreational activities to keep them moving and motivated during the summer. ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES & PROMOTIONS WITHIN THE BERNALILLO POLICE DEPARTMENT

FROM POLICE CHIEF TOM ROMERO



The Town of Bernalillo Police Department has made several organizational changes to better serve the community, of which involves the development of a unit and the promotion of several officers.

Prior to this, there was no Investigation Unit established within the department. As a result, the field officers had to balance their daily duties, service calls, as well as follow up on major incidents. Sergeant Josh Anderson, who has been with the Bernalillo Police

Department for sixteen (16) years, has been transferred to the Investigation Unit. For this assignment, he will be coordinating the investigation of major criminal incidents within the Town of Bernalillo. Sergeant Anderson's transition to the Investigation Unit will enable the department, as a whole, to function more effectively for the town.

In addition to these changes, the Bernalillo Police Department conducted promotional processes which led to the advancement of several officers. Officer Shane Hernandez was promoted to Field Sergeant and Officers Stephen Stover, Monica Torres, and Sal Tortorici were all promoted to Field Corporals. The new field corporals will be under the direction of veteran Sergeants Tim Tyler and Darrel Sanchez, as well as newly promoted Sergeant Hernandez. Each will be on one of three shifts that provide service to the Town of Bernalillo on a 24 hour, 7 day basis.

The officers and supervisory staff of the Police Department have a total of 118 years served to the Town of Bernalillo, not including their prior law enforcement service and experience. It is with this experience, unit development, and promotions that the Bernalillo Police Department strives to serve the Town of Bernalillo and endeavor to keep the peace of its community and uphold the safety of its citizens.

The Town of Bernalillo has had many different members behind the scenes making sure the community is best served by its municipality and its traditions are upheld throughout the years. In this position she was instrumental in the long, successful run of the New Mexico Wine Festival, the Annual Night Time Christmas Parade, and most recently the Mountain West Brew Fest. Maria also established the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) that helped to preserve several historic properties around Bernalillo.

The Governing Body of the Town of Bernalillo will recognize Maria on her retirement at an upcoming Town Council Meeting. Our community has been well served by Maria's efforts over the years, and for that we all wish Maria a very happy, restful, and well deserved retirement! Thank you so much for years of dedication and hard work.
