USE THE TOWN PARK FOR YOUR EVENT!

The Town of Bernalillo has some great parks facilities located throughout the town that are perfect places to host your next event. Family reunions, company picnics, quinceañeras, weddings, softball or soccer games, graduation parties, or other get-togethers are all perfect events to have at one of our parks. All events held in any of the parks must be reserved through a reservation contract.

Use of the park for small special events is free to residents of the Town of Bernalillo, although residents will be asked to pay a fully refundable cleaning deposit.

Large, special events will be asked to pay a fee, provide certificates of insurance, refundable cleaning deposits and, depending on the scope of the event, traffic control plans, security and sanitation.



We are committed to providing a healthy, safe park environment for your recreational enjoyment. In order to assist us in continuing to meet this standard, please observe the following guidelines:

- Please pick up after your event
- Do not drive motor vehicles on to the grass
- Do not drive tent stakes or other objects into the ground unless you first have permission from the Parks Department
- No alcohol is allowed at any of the parks
- No pets are allowed off of their leash while in the parks
- Other guidelines are outlined in reservation contract

DRINKING WATER Q&A

How can I determine if the discoloration in my drinking water is a problem in my home or with the Town's system?

Is the water coming out of your tap yellow, brown or red? Here are some simple questions that may tell you whether the problem is on your end or not:

1. Is the water colored when you first turn on the tap in the morning or after not using it for awhile?
2. Does the water run clear after a few minutes?
3. Are only some of your taps affected?
4. Are you the only one in the neighborhood with the problem?
5. Is it only the hot water that is colored?

If you answered yes to any of the above questions, then the problem is probably with your plumbing. If you answered yes to the last question, the problem is more than likely with your water heater. In either case, you should call a plumber.

If you answered no to the last 4 questions, then you should contact the Town of Bernalillo Public Works Department at 771-7124.



SAVE WATER & SAVE ENERGY

Saving energy and water does more than help the environment, but also helps you save on your utility bills. In each issue we'll offer three simple tips to help you save:

- Buy reusable shopping bags and store them in your car to have whenever you're at a store where you'll need a bag. Shoppers worldwide are using approximately 500 billion single-use plastic bags per year - this translates to about a million bags every minute across the globe or 150 bags a year for every person on earth.
- Paper accounts for 25% of landfill waste and 33% of municipal waste, so use washable towels rather than paper towels whenever possible, reuse paper, and recycle paper as you can.
- To conserve water usage, when you're washing dishes by hand, avoid allowing the tap to run. Fill one bin with water and rinse as needed.

HAPPY SPRING...ALMOST

In case you want to know, the first day of Spring for 2019 is Wednesday, March 20th. So, why does the first day of spring change from year to year? The March Equinox would occur on the same day every year if the Earth took exactly 365 days to make a complete revolution around the Sun. But this is not the case. It takes the Earth about 365.25 days on average to go around the Sun once. The Gregorian Calendar accounts for this by adding an extra day - the leap day - almost every 4 years. This means that each March Equinox occurs about 6 hours later than the previous year's (timeanddate.com).
