





Water and Sewer Rate Increases

On August 11, 2015 the Town council approved Ordinances 289 and 290. These ordinances amended the water and wastewater rate structure for the Town. Last month we published rate comparisons. This month we are publishing *the new monthly rates*. The rate increase is due to increases in electrical costs, equipment costs, material costs, and annual inflation and to help ensure the Town can continue to meet regulatory requirements, maintain the systems, and provide water and wastewater service to customers.

Work is complete on the South Hill Pond Modifications, done by Sierra Valley Contractors. The project expanded the size of the pond, and fixed damage caused by rainstorms in 2013, when the pond twice held water which could have flooded downstream neighborhoods.

On September 15, the ESCAFCA Board of Directors awarded a contract to Salls Brothers Construction, Inc. for almost 1.8 million dollars to build the Canyon del Agua East dam. The dam is just east of I-25, on the big arroyo that flows under Interstate 25 just north of MCT Industries, and has periodically flooded South Hill Road, adjacent properties, and the Bernalillo Acequia. The dam will be built on 11.5 acres of land donated to ESCAFCA by Fisher Sand and Gravel.

Salls Brothers Construction is expected to start construction of the dam in November 2015, completing in April 2016. Salls built the very successful Athena Pond/Park project in the spring of 2013, just in time for it to sustain two storm events in the summer of 2013.

Late this fall, ESCAFCA will also be bidding a small contract to construct a storm drain in Melissa Drive from the Bernalillo Acequia west to Athena Pond, which will drain into Athena Pond through a long concrete desilting structure, which will also double as spectator seating on the east side of the pond/park. This will be done in conjunction with a Town of Bernalillo project to make drainage improvements to South Hill Road.


