22nd Annual NM Wine Festival

Wine making is a tradition in Bernalillo going back to the 1800s and it is fitting and proper that Bernalillo hosts the state's premier wine festival. The Town of Bernalillo sponsors the New Mexico Wine Festival as a key economic and tourism development project. The festival is on Labor Day Weekend, September 5—7, 2009, noon—7:00 p.m.

A family event, Mayor Patricia A. Chávez invites residents to attend. The festival has something for everyone; a showcase of the best New Mexico wineries, award winning artisans, and 12 top-notch bands. Food vendors, face painting, and a kid's zone by 'A Ton of Fun' will make it a fun-filled event for kids.

The Vial of Life and New House Numbers

Improvements in 911 Medical Emergency Response

Mayor Patricia A. Chávez, Town of Bernalillo Fire and Administration Departments have taken another step forward in its effort to meet growing Bernalillo citizen safety needs, especially with seniors and the chronically ill.

Responding to an emergency 911 call is only half the battle. Imagine when emergency response personnel arrive on the scene to find an unconscious senior citizen or invalid who cannot communicate and there is no one around to advise on his/her condition. How does one determine how to treat this patient and what drugs to administer? It is vitally important to get accurate medical and drug treatment information immediately. In partnership with Wal-Mart, the Bernalillo Fire department has found a solution. They recently began handing out special prescription containers called Vials of Life.

Each vial has a preprinted information form and instructions such as: where to keep the vial (*on the top shelf of your refrigerator door) and where to place the Vial of Life decal (*on the door/window of the main entrance to your home).

For cars/trucks, put the Vial in the glove box and the decal on a window. The information should contain your past medical history, your medications, food or drug allergies and emergency contact information including your primary care doctor.

Immediate Success The Vial of Life and the recent E911 Address Canvassing project have already delivered benefits. Within a few days of the initial distribution of the Vials, a 911 call to a home found a lady unable to breathe or speak due to swelling in her throat caused by a food allergy. Her Vial indicated an allergy to peanuts and she responded immediately to treatment. Fire Chief John Estrada commented, "Her new address numbers and the information in the Vial saved critical time to help save her life."

Where to Pick Up The Vials and New House Numbers You can pick up the Vial of Life prescription bottles at the Fire Department at the south end of Town Hall or at the reception area of Town Hall. If your street address numbers are missing, faded or damaged, you can pick up new numbers at Town Hall. The house numbers and Vials of Life are free of charge.

On August 18, 2009, Mayor Patricia A. Chávez joined NM Governor Bill Richardson, Pueblo of Sandia Governor Joe Lujan, and other state, county and local officials in breaking ground on the NMDOT \$28.4 million GRIP project that will extend the 6-lanes on I-25 from Tramway to the NM 473 interchange (exit 240) in Bernalillo. The project was awarded to FNF Construction. The project will be phased so that 2 lanes in each direction (NB & SB) remain open for the majority of the construction.
