## **New Fire Truck**

The Mayor and Town Council at the council meeting of November 13, 2006 approved the financing of a new Fire Truck for the Town of Bernalillo Volunteer Fire Department. The Volunteer Fire Department has not had a new fire truck in over 10 years. Volunteers are excited to provide residents of Bernalillo enhanced service with the new equipment. ## **Walking Jogging Trail**

Sandoval County has begun work on a walking-jogging trail along Calle Don Tomas. The project is a joint effort between the Town of Bernalillo and Sandoval County and will include an asphalt paved path on the east side of Don Tomas from Highway 550 to Calle Barrio Nuevo. From Calle Barrio Nuevo, the path will cross Don Tomas to the west side of the street and continue as a concrete sidewalk and curb into Rotary Park. Construction is expected to be complete in early spring.

## **Grant Received**

The Town of Bernalillo has received a grant from the Youth Conservation Corps for the restoration of the 1917 barn at the Loretto Community park. The Town will partner with Cornerstones Community Partnership on the restoration project and will employ youth from the community. Our youth will receive training in adobe restoration and carpentry skills to facilitate their career development.

The selection process will target youth, 14 through 20, who have dropped out of school, or are at risk of being unemployed, or are underemployed due to lack of skills. **Rail Runner Fares**

Commuters will be able to purchase one-way, round trip and month passes online or directly from train attendants. One way passes are \$2.00, or \$3.00 for round trips; and \$50.00 for monthly passes. Senior, disabled, and student discounts are offered.

The outbound train leaves the Sandoval County/ US 550 station at 6:05 a.m., 7:10 a.m., 8:20 a.m., 12:05 p.m., 4:55 p.m., 6:05 p.m., and 7:10 p.m. For return train schedules, go to <http://www.nmrailrunner.com/>.

The Sandoval County / US 550 station is serviced to and from the county park and ride location on Idalia Road, near the Judicial Complex. Bus connections from there and in Albuquerque are wheelchair accessible, and run in conjunction with scheduled, or with quick connections to the Rail Runner.

The Concerned Citizens Hotline is in place so that residents and businesses can contribute to policing Bernalillo. Call in to report graffiti, crime tips, neighborhood loitering, gang and drug activity, and other suspect or disturbing activity.

The hotline is manned by the Bernalillo Police Department and all calls are investigated and action taken by the responsible department. The range of call activity include reports of congestion on Hwy. 550, drug and graffiti reporting, and concerns with a preliminary Streetscape option of reducing main street to two lanes, and media reporting of incidents occurring in Bernalillo.
