I think most residents would agree that it's great we've gotten rain these past few weeks. But rain leads to weeds and they grow everywhere and on everyone's property. Please take the time to maintain your property in compliance with Town of Bernalillo Ordinance #73 which requires that weeds in excess of four inches in height must be removed from the following areas:

- Within the front, rear or side yard setbacks of the property
- Between your property line and the middle of the alley adjacent to the property
- Between your property line and the curb
- The area of any curbs or sidewalks on the property
- And the area ten feet outside the property line where there is no curb

It takes work to remove weeds each time they appear. But that work pays off. By getting rid of the weeds, fewer allergens will be released into the air, less fuel will exist in the case of a fire on your property, and the community will look orderly and unblighted. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

The Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan is designed to assist local governments in focusing on long range and short range infrastructure planning. Given that infrastructure demands generally outweigh infrastructure financing, priorities are critical in ensuring that the needs of the community are met efficiently.


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Since standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding, it's important to have protection from the floods associated with hurricanes, tropical storms, heavy rains and other conditions that impact the U.S.

In 1968, Congress created the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) to help provide a means for property owners to financially protect themselves. The NFIP offers flood insurance to homeowners, renters, and business owners if their community participates in the NFIP. Participating communities agree to adopt and enforce ordinances that meet or exceed FEMA requirements to reduce the risk of flooding.

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which works closely with nearly 90 private insurance companies to offer flood insurance to property owners and renters. In order to qualify for flood insurance, a community must join the NFIP and agree to enforce sound floodplain management standards. The Town of Bernalillo is an active NFIP participant.

The NFIP, a federal program, offers flood insurance, which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents. Rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent. These rates depend on many factors, which include the date and type of construction of your home, along with your buildings level of risk.
