AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE TOWN OF BERNALILLO BUILDING CODE AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS (TEXT) TO CHANGE REQUIRED WORDING

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WHEREAS, the 48th Legislature of the State of New Mexico, First Session, 2007, Amended Section 3-17-6 NMSA 1978; and,

WHEREAS, municipalities shall not be in conflict with the laws of the State of New Mexico; and,

WHEREAS, some administrative review costs are not currently recovered under the Town of Bernalillo Building Code and Performance Standards Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, application and filing fees should cover the full amount necessary for all aspects of the required administrative review, in order that new development not be a financial burden on existing Town residents and businesses;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF BERNALILLO, SANDOVAL COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, AS FOLLOWS:

That the text of Ordinance No. 199 entitled the “The Town of Bernalillo Building Code and Performance Standards” be hereby amended to provide for a change to the required language to reflect current State of New Mexico law, use, and terms as designated in “Exhibit ‘A’” attached hereto.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
CITY OF RIO RANCHO, TOWN OF BERNALILLO AND SANDOVAL COUNTY, NEW

MEXICO

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made and entered into this 13th day of April, 2009, by and between the CITY OF RIO RANCHO, NEW MEXICO, hereinafter referred to as City; the TOWN OF BERNALILLO, NEW MEXICO, hereinafter referred to as Town; and the COUNTY OF SANDOVAL, NEW MEXICO, hereinafter referred to as County.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are collective recipients of Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program funding totaling Two Hundred Forty Three Thousand Eight Hundred Five Dollars (\$243,805); and

WHEREAS, the City of Rio Rancho desires to be the fiscal agent for such funding; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this MOU is in the best interests of all parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this MOU; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual obligations set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

Section One. The City shall serve as the fiscal agent for all JAG funding received. As the fiscal agent, the City shall disseminate JAG funding as follows:

- a. The City agrees to pay County a total of \$31,395 of JAG funding within two weeks of receiving such funding.
- b. The City agrees to pay Town a total of \$68,949 of JAG funds within two weeks of receiving such funding.
- c. The City shall retain \$143,461 of JAG funding for its own use.

Section Two. Each party shall use its allocated JAG funding in accordance with the rules and regulations as set forth by the U.S. Department of Justice. All funding described herein shall be spent within a three year period ending June 30, 2012.

Section Three. Nothing in the performance of this MOU shall impose any liability for claims against the City, the Town or the County other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

Section Four. Each party to this MOU will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this MOU and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services of the other parties.

132 **Section Five.** The parties to this MOU do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by
133 virtue of this MOU.

135 **Section Six.** By entering into this MOU, the parties do not intend to create any obligations,
136 express or implied, other than those set out herein; further, this MOU shall not create any rights in
137 any party not a signatory hereto.

171 ***WHEREAS***, **Application** and filing fees should cover the full amount necessary for all
172 aspects of the required administrative review, in order that new development not be a
173 financial burden on existing Town residents and businesses; *and*,

175 **WHEREAS**, Any person desiring a permit shall, at the time of filing an application therefore, pay to
 176 the Town a fee in the amount specified herein, which this resolution adopts by reference together with all
 177 amendments and future editions thereof;

178
 179 **THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the Town of Bernalillo that:

 181 **The fee for the Town of Bernalillo Floodplain Development Permit, shall be Sixty-**
 182 **five dollars (\$65.00) and is hereby approved and entered into.**

201 **MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF RIO RANCHO**
202 **AND**
203 **THE TOWN OF BERNALILLO**

204

205 THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into effective this 13th day of April 2009,

206 By and between the CITY OF RIO RANCHO, hereinafter called "CITY" and the TOWN
207 OF BERNALILLO, hereinafter called "TOWN".

208

WITNESSETH:

209 **WHEREAS**, the CITY and the TOWN are desirous of entering into an agreement specific to the
210 CITY'S construction, operation, maintenance, repair and ownership of public infrastructure
211 improvements as shown on Exhibit 'A', hereinafter called "IMPROVEMENTS", for Special Assessment
212 District 8, said IMPROVEMENTS to be located within the right-of-way of Camino Alto, a roadway
213 within the limits of the TOWN, and,

214 **WHEREAS**, the IMPROVEMENTS shall include an 8" water line and appurtenances, an 8"

215 sanitary sewer line and manholes, and 36” to 48” storm drain lines as shown graphically on said Exhibit
216 ‘A’; and,

217 **WHEREAS**, the storm drain pipe includes a 48” outlet pipe from a storm drainage pond located at
218 the northwest corner of the intersection of Hapsburg Road within the CITY and Camino Alto within the
219 TOWN and said 48” outlet pipe shall connect to a storm drain system to be located within the right of
220 way of Calle Baack, a roadway within the TOWN; and,

221 **WHEREAS**, both parties will benefit from the management of the cross-boundary watershed to be
222 conveyed in the resultant combined storm drain systems;

223 **NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND**
224 **PROMISES HEREINAFTER CONTAINED, BE IT AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:**

225 The TOWN hereby grants to the CITY, and its successors and assigns, a License to construct,
226 operate, maintain and repair the IMPROVEMENTS in the Camino Alto right of way, together with full
227 ingress thereto subject to the following terms and conditions:
228

- 229 1. All plans for the construction of the IMPROVEMENTS shall obtain CITY Approval and shall
230 be subject to review and written approval by the TOWN prior to commencement of construction.
231
- 232 2. Before the Construction of the IMPROVEMENTS begins, the CITY shall notify the TOWN’s
233 Field Engineer in writing ten days before beginning work in the right of way and shall also have
234 the contractor notify the TOWN verbally two days prior to beginning said work.
235
- 236 3. Construction of the IMPROVEMENTS shall be subject to periodic inspection by TOWN
237 inspectors and staff. Any TOWN comments shall be directed to the CITY Project Manager with
238 a copy provided to the ENGINEER
239
- 240 4. Workmanship and materials shall conform to the American Public Works Association Standard
241 Specifications for Public Works construction.
242
- 243 5. The CITY shall provide the TOWN with one set of “as built” prints within thirty (30) days of
244 acceptance of the work by the CITY.
245
- 246 6. The CONTRACTOR’S WARRANTY shall warranty all work within the TOWN right-of-way
247 to be free of defects in workmanship and adequate for design flows for a period of one year after
248 acceptance by the CITY.
249
- 250 7. Subject to a review and approval from the CITY Engineer, the CITY shall be permitted to
251 modify the IMPROVEMENTS as constructed in the right of way, provided that such
252 modification shall be jointly agreed to by the TOWN, in writing, in advance of such work.
253
- 254 8. All construction, operation, maintenance, repair, relocation and removal of IMPROVEMENTS
255 shall be accomplished at sole expense of the CITY. After CITY acceptance of the
256 IMPROVEMENTS, the CITY shall assume operation, maintenance, repair, relocation and

- 257 removal responsibilities at the CITY'S expense. All work shall be performed in such a manner
258 as will not damage or interfere with the operation and maintenance of the TOWN'S roadway and
259 water utility and equipment. Any existing survey control or right-of-way monuments that are
260 moved or destroyed as a result of the actions permitted by this License Agreement shall be
261 replaced by a registered surveyor at the expense of the CITY.
262
- 263 9. As between the CITY and TOWN, each party acknowledges that it will be responsible for
264 claims or damages arising from personal injury or damage to persons or tangible property to the
265 extent they result from negligence of its employees. The liability of the CITY and the TOWN
266 shall in all cases be subject to the limitations and immunities of the New Mexico Tort Claims
267 Act Section 41-4-1 et.seq., NMSA 1978, as amended.
268
- 269 10. Should the CITY fail to comply with the provisions of the License Agreement, or should the
270 CITY fail to properly maintain its portion of the IMPROVEMENTS, this License Agreement
271 and all rights and privileges herein granted may be terminated by the TOWN. However, such
272 termination shall be proceeded by written notice, giving the CITY at least thirty (30) days. The
273 TOWN may perform the required repair or maintenance and invoice the CITY for incurred
274 costs. The CITY shall pay such costs within sixty (60) days of the date of said invoice.
275
- 276 11. This License Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of New Mexico.
277
- 278 12. In the event of a dispute between the CITY and the TOWN regarding the License Agreement,
279 the prevailing Party shall be entitled to the reimbursement of its costs and reasonable attorney's
280 fees.
281
