On behalf of myself, the Town Council, and everyone at the Town of Bernalillo, congratulations to the Class of 2020.

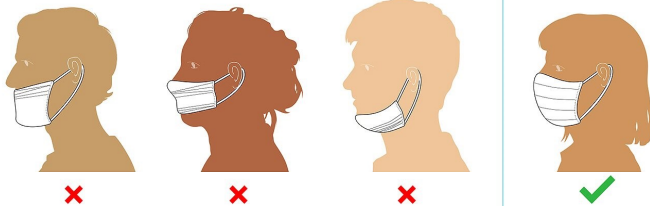

## GUIDANCE ON FACE COVERINGS

**How Cloth Face Coverings Work.** Cloth face coverings prevent the person wearing the mask from spreading respiratory droplets when talking, sneezing, or coughing. If everyone wears a cloth face covering when out in public, such as going to the grocery store, the risk of exposure can be reduced for the community. Since people can spread the virus before symptoms start, or even if people never have symptoms, wearing a face covering can protect others around you. Face coverings worn by others protect you from getting the virus from people carrying the virus. *Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.*

**If I Wear a Mask/Cloth Face Covering, Does that Mean I can STOP Social Distancing?** No. Face coverings should be used along with keeping six feet of physical distance between yourself and others, washing your hands often, and disinfecting high-touch surfaces. Keeping space between you and others is one of the best ways to avoid being exposed to the virus that causes COVID-19.



**When Using a Cloth Face Covering/Mask, Make Sure:**

- To cover your nose, chin, and mouth fully
- The coverings fit snug against the side of your face so there are no gaps
- You do not have any difficulty breathing while wearing a cloth face covering/mask
- The cloth face covering/mask can be tied or otherwise secured to prevent slipping

**Also, Don't Forget:**

- Avoid touching your face as much as possible
- Keep the covering clean
- Clean hands with soap & water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer before putting on, after touching/adjusting, or removing the face covering
- Don't share YOUR covering with anyone else unless it is washed & dried first
- You should be the only person handling your covering

### MOVING FORWARD: WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU VISIT

**NO MASK means NO SERVICE!** The Town is adopting a strict policy that no individuals who wish to come into Town Hall will be allowed to stay if they are not wearing an adequate face covering and to be worn properly. ***Wearing a face covering in public is a required directive put forth by Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham.***

**Appointments Only!** Any individuals who wish to conduct business at Town Hall must do so by appointments only. Only the individual involved in the transaction will be permitted into the building.
